## Pennsylvania Brings in \$2.7 Billion in Revenue Collections

On December 29th the Governor certified an official revenue estimate for the FY 2015-16 equal to \$30.87 billion. The monthly distribution of this estimate will be released in late January. As a result, this economic brief compares monthly revenue collections to the prior year collections. General Fund revenue collections for the month of December were \$2.7 billion. Tax revenue collections grew by 1.8% as compared to December 2014.

The Commonwealth collected \$528 million in Corporate Taxes which is a decrease of 6.3% compared to December 2014. Pennsylvania collected \$824 million in Sales Taxes, which is a growth of 2.5%, and \$1.07 Billion in Personal Income Taxes which is an increase of 4.6%.

Year-to-date revenue collections for FY 2015-16 are \$13.4 billion. Year-to date tax revenue collections have grown by 2.6% as compared to FY 2014-15.

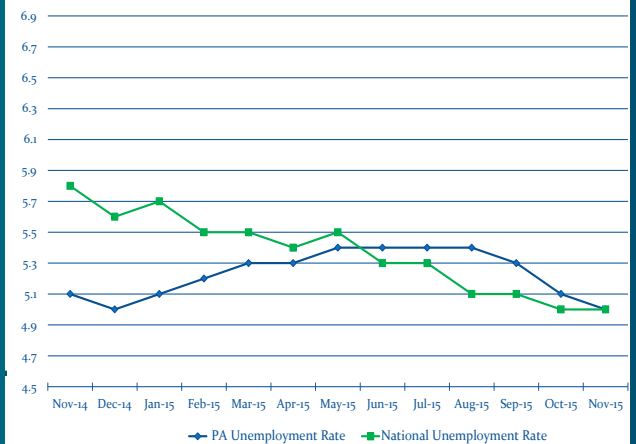

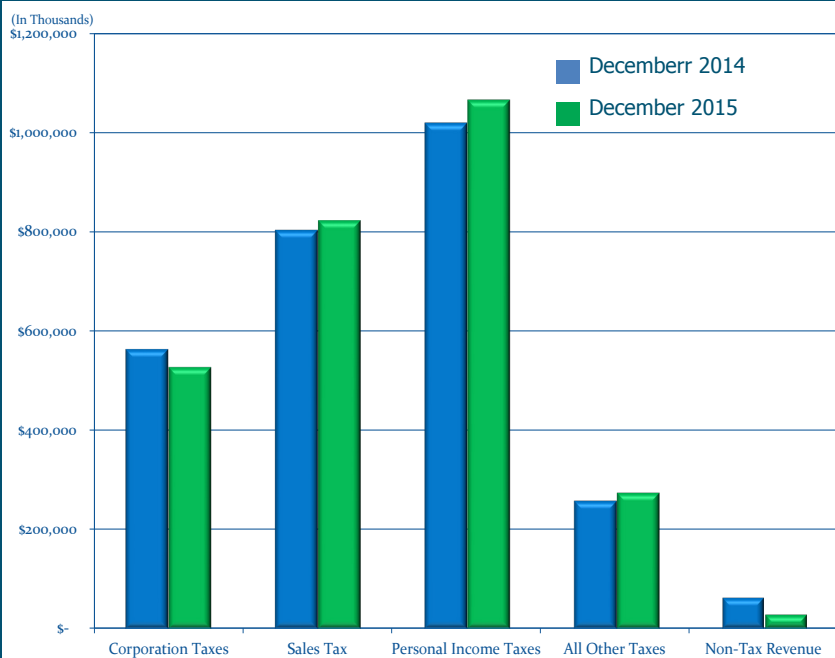
